



**National Arts Council (NAC) - University of the Arts (UAS) Arts Scholarship
(for full-time undergraduate and postgraduate students)**

Terms and conditions

1. The NAC-UAS Arts Scholarship is a joint scholarship established between the University of the Arts Singapore (UAS) and the National Arts Council (NAC) to nurture outstanding students enrolled in UAS undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, to develop the next generation of arts leaders in Singapore.

2. The NAC-UAS Arts Scholarship is open to Singapore citizens and permanent residents enrolled in UAS full-time undergraduate and postgraduate programmes as listed below:

- BA (Hons) Acting
- BA (Hons) Arts Management
- BA (Hons) Contemporary Chinese Theatres
- BA (Hons) Fine Arts
- BA (Hons) Music
- BA (Hons) Music Business
- BA (Hons) Musical Theatre
- BA (Hons) Arts Histories and Curatorial Practices: Asia and the World
- BA (Hons) International Dance and Contemporary Practices
- MA Art Therapy
- MA Arts and Cultural Leadership
- MA Arts Pedagogy and Practice
- MA Asian Art Histories
- MA Creative Writing
- MA Fine Arts
- MA Arts and Ecology
- MA Music Therapy
- MFA Fine Art

3. Scholarship award quantum

a. 100% of the total costs of tuition fees and compulsory fees* payable for the enrolled programme, as well as monthly maintenance allowance (capped at S\$1,100 per month).

**Compulsory fees refer to any fees (other than tuition fees) incurred by the student and charged as part of their programme at the institution. This includes, but is not limited to registration fees, administration fees, library fees, medical insurance, and fees for Ezlink card. However, it does not include expenses for books and/or equipment, accommodation/utility bills, and personal/travel insurance.*

b. Scholarship recipients must maintain a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of at least 4.0 every academic year, and maintain good conduct throughout his/her course of study in order to renew the scholarship up to a maximum of two years for the MA programmes or three years for the BA programmes or the minimum duration required to complete the course, whichever is shorter.

4. Service commitment

a. Scholarship recipients will be required to submit the Service Commitment Report (part 1) at least six months prior to graduation, and part 2 of the report after graduating for one and two years.

b. Scholarship recipients must commit to two (2) years in the Singapore arts industry upon graduation.

5. Other conditions

a. Scholarship recipients will not be eligible for a government bursary, i.e. Higher Education Community Bursary (HECB) or Higher Education Bursary (HEB).

b. A scholarship recipient who voluntarily intermits or withdraws or is dismissed from the programme will be required to refund the full scholarship amount that has been disbursed, i.e. paid tuition fees and monthly maintenance allowances received by the student.

c. For intermissions cases, the award will not be carried forward to subsequent semester(s)/academic year(s). The student may apply for other scholarships or bursaries when he/she resumes studies, if eligible.
